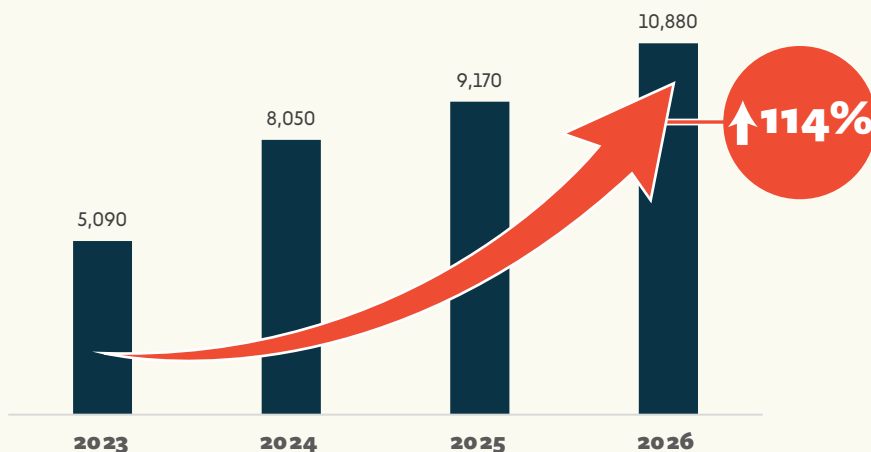


HUNGER IN JEFFERSON COUNTY

1 in every 8 people are considered food insecure.¹



Since 2023, the number of people experiencing food insecurity in Jefferson County has increased by **114%**, driven by rising food, housing, and utility costs, the end of pandemic-era assistance programs, and ongoing economic pressures. As a result, food banks are seeing unprecedented demand, with more people turning to hunger-relief services and needing support more often.

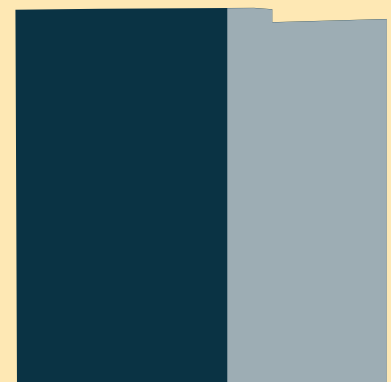
